Luke 24:1-43

Now on the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they, and certain other women with them, came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. 2 But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. **3 Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.** 4 And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. **5 Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?"** 6 He is not here, but is risen! Remember how He spoke to you when He was still in Galilee, **7 saying, "The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again."** 8 And they remembered His words. **9 Then they returned from the tomb and told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest.** 10 It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them, who told these things to the apostles. **11 And their words seemed to them like idle tales, and they did not believe them.** 12 But Peter arose and ran to the tomb; and stooping down, he saw the linen cloths lying by themselves; and he departed, marveling to himself at what had happened. **:13 Now behold, two of them were traveling that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was seven miles from Jerusalem.** 14 And they talked together of all these things which had happened. **15 So it was, while they conversed and reasoned, that Jesus Himself drew near and went with them.** 16 But their eyes were restrained, so that they did not know Him. **:17 And He said to them, "What kind of conversation is this that you have with one another as you walk and are sad?"** :18 Then the one whose name was Cleopas answered and said to Him, "Are You the only stranger in Jerusalem, and have You not known the things which happened there in these days?" **:19 And He said to them, "What things?" So they said to Him, "The things concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a Prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people,** 20 and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to be condemned to death, and crucified Him. **21 But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, today is the third day since these things happened.** 22 Yes, and certain women of our company, who arrived at the tomb early, astonished us. **23 When they did not find His body, they came saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said He was alive.** 24 And certain of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but Him they did not see." **:25 Then He said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken!** 26 Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?" **27 And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself.** :28 Then they drew near to the village where they were going, and He indicated that He would have gone farther. **29 But they constrained Him, saying, "Abide with us, for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent."** And He went in to stay with them. :30 Now it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, that He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. **31 Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight.** :32 And they said to one another, "Did not our heart burn within us while He talked with us on the road, and while He opened the Scriptures to us?" **33 So they rose up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven and those who were with them gathered together,** 34 saying, "The Lord is risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon (Peter)!" **35 And they spoke about the things that had happened on the road, and how Jesus was known to them in the breaking of bread.** :36 Now as they said these things, Jesus Himself stood in the midst of them, and said to them, "Peace to you." **37 But they were terrified and frightened, and supposed they had seen a spirit.** 38 And He said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do doubts arise in your hearts? **39 Behold My hands and My feet, that it is I Myself. Handle Me and see, for a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see I have."** :40 When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His feet. **41 But while they still did not believe for joy, and marveled, He said to them, "Have you any food here?"** 42 So they gave Him a piece of a broiled fish and some honeycomb. **43 And He took it and ate in their presence.**

7.) Never Again will you need to doubt v.5b-8

Luke 24:5d-8

They said to them, *“Why do you seek the living among the dead? 6 He is not here, but is risen Remember how He spoke to you when He was still in Galilee, 7 saying, “The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.” :8 And they remembered His words.*

Remembered grk: mimnesko; to call up as from a well. to bring up and into the thoughts. To recall, recollect – to call into remembrance !!!

“Imagine **if** they would have believed in the **Scriptures** and **Jesus** at the same time?

They wouldn’t have feared and they wouldn’t have been in doubt”

9 Then they returned from the tomb and told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. 10 It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them, **who told these things to the apostles.** 11 **But their words seemed to them like idle tales, and they did not believe them.** 12 **But Peter arose and ran** to the tomb; and stooping down, he saw the linen cloths lying by themselves; and he departed, marveling to himself at what had happened.

Mark 16:2-8

Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. 3 And they said among themselves, “Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?” 4 But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away—for it was very large. 5 And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. :6 But he said to them, “Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. 7 But go, tell His disciples—and Peter—that Jesus is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you.”

From the Tomb to the Sea of Galilee, that's 90 miles on foot " let's go, go, go, go – YALLA"

9.) Never Again will you need to be alone

v.31-32

31 Then **their eyes were opened** and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight. **:32** And they said to one another, "**Did not our heart burn within us** while He talked with us on the road, and while He **opened the Scriptures to us ?**"

What does Isolation. Loneliness, Separation do to a person?

It reveals things to you that have been inside waiting to get out.

"It's so easy to hide from yourself and from others as long as you're in a crowded room.

But it's Jesus who meets us in the hours of Isolation. He touches us in our Loneliness and comes to us in the Separation."

Verse 31a

Then (then speaks to a moment in time) **their eyes** (not eyeballs but their understanding) **were opened** (this speaks to the fact that their ignorance was pushed aside) **and they knew** (this means that there was an instant connection, a bonding, a link) **Him:** (personally)

Verse 31b

and He vanished from their sight.
