Introduction to the Text;

2nd Corinthians 8:1-9

As Christians, it comes as no surprise, that what God has called us **to do** is very much impossible. What he has called us **to know** and **to preach** and **to be** like is very much impossible! – **But with God all things** are possible.

That's why - everything about Biblical Christianity is

and must be based upon "God's Unmerited Grace" – His grace is His ability, choice, will and delight to show us His favor and benefit for no other reason other than God is Good & Gracious.

2 Cor. 8:2-3

Now the Passover, a feast of the Jews, was near. :5 Then Jesus lifted up His eyes, and seeing a great multitude coming toward Him, He said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread, that these may eat?" :6 But this He said to test him, for He Himself knew what He would do. :7 Philip answered Him, "Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may have a little." :8 One of His disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to Him, :9 "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two small fish, but what are they among so many?"

gift + fellowship + ministering = church

This is the secret to real wealth and the key to everything else in life.

"they first gave themselves to the Lord"

when we talk about "dedication" or "dedicating" something to a cause, an effort or God, it's to be the best of the offering.

When things are "devoted" – they get around.

God is not interested in having you sit in church all day long. He's interested in you getting up and out of here to influence the world for Jesus' sake.

Oliver Cromwell

During the reign of Oliver Cromwell, the British government began to run low on silver for coins. Lord Cromwell sent his men to the local cathedral to see if they could find any precious metal there. After investigating, they reported, The only silver we can find is in the statues of the saints standing in the corners, to which the radical soldier and statesman of England replied: "Good! We'll melt down the saints and put them in circulation!" That brief but direct order states the essence of the practical goal of authentic Christianity: Not rows of silver saints crammed into the corners of cathedrals, but melted saints circulating through the mainstream of humanity.

Are you not of more value than they? 27 Which of you by worrying can add one cubit to his stature? :28 "So why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin 29 and yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 30 Now if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? :31 "Therefore do not worry, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?" or "What shall we wear?" 32 For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things (the other stuff) shall be added to you.

You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.

"When he was but sixteen years old he left his home in Kent, England to seek employment in New York City. Having previously worked in a soap manufacturing shop he sought to do the same in America. While he was on his way he shared with the ship captain that he was "Traveling to America that he might make soap in New York City", at that the man gave him this advice: 'Son, someone will be the best soap maker in New York city some day. You can be that man. But you must never lose sight of the fact that everything about the soap you make will be given to you by God. Honor Him by giving what you earn."

And so William Colgate began his tireless labor and with it he gave throughout his long and successful business career. At first Colgate gave a tenth of his earnings until he started his own soap manufacturing company. Devoting his success to God he found it a delight to have to increase his giving to 20% and then 40% until eventually the Colgate Company became the world's leading maker of soaps. By the end of William Colgate's life, he was able live off 10% of what the companies had profited. During the later years of his life Colgate revealed the origin of his great success, "All that I was going to have, all that I have ever had has been devoted to God and His glory."
