Judges Teaches Us That They Had Failed.
They allowed the corruption, idolatry, and pagan worship to continue.

CHAPTERS 1:1 TO 3:6

DEFINES JUST WHERE ISRAEL WAS IN ITS JOURNEY WITH GOD.

Verse 1

Now after the death of Joshua it came to pass that **the children of Israel** asked the LORD.

He had told them from the beginning that He had called them out from among the world.

Deuteronomy 7:1-8

"When the LORD your God brings you into the land which you go to possess, and has cast out many nations before you, the Hittites and the Girgashites and the Amorites and the Canaanites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites, seven nations greater and mightier than you,...: 5 But thus you shall deal with them: you shall destroy their altars, and break down their sacred pillars, and cut down their wooden images, and burn their carved images with fire. :6 "For you are a holy people to the LORD your God; the LORD your God has chosen you to be a people for Himself, a special treasure above all the peoples on the face of the earth. :7 The LORD did not set His love on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any other people, for you were the least of all peoples; :8 but because the LORD loves you,

1.) Remember - Israel was in need of leadership

Judges 1:19 So the LORD was with Judah. And they drove out the mountaineers, but they could not drive out the inhabitants of the lowland, because they had chariots of iron.

Judges 1:20 And they gave Hebron to Caleb, as Moses had said. Then he expelled from there the three sons of Anak.

Judges 1:21 But the children of Benjamin *did not drive out* the Jebusites who inhabited Jerusalem; so the Jebusites dwell with the children of Benjamin in Jerusalem to this day.

2.) Recognize - Israel was in need of vision

a person, a family, a nation, a "anything"

without a vision, a purpose to press on will cease to exist

Judges 1:22 And the house of Joseph also went up against Bethel, and the LORD was with them.

Judges 1:23 So the house of Joseph sent men to spy out **Bethel**. (The name of the city *was* formerly Luz.)

Back in the Day - Joshua Had Led Them (very well)
But Who was In The Wings?

- 3. The Believer is to be Hearing from the Lord

Recognize what God has Called us to.

Why Are Men So Afraid to Travel

(from one spiritual mountain to the next)

Somehow, They Had Failed to Take Joshua's Example to Heart.

3.) Renew - Israel was in need of entering in

Judges 1:27 However, Manasseh did not drive out the inhabitants of Beth Shean and its villages, or Taanach and its villages, or the inhabitants of Dor and its villages, or the inhabitants of Ibleam and its villages, or the inhabitants of Megiddo and its villages; for the Canaanites were determined to dwell in that land. :28 And it came to pass, when Israel was strong, that they put the Canaanites under tribute, but did not completely drive them out. :29 Nor did Ephraim drive out the Canaanites who dwelt in Gezer; so the Canaanites dwelt in Gezer among them. :30 Nor did Zebulun drive out the inhabitants of Kitron or the inhabitants of Nahalol; so the Canaanites dwelt among them, and were put under tribute. :31 Nor did Asher drive out the inhabitants of Acco or the inhabitants of Sidon, or of Ahlab, Achzib, Helbah, Aphik, or Rehob. :32 So the Asherites dwelt among the Canaanites, the inhabitants of the land; for they did not drive them out. :33 Nor did Naphtali drive out the inhabitants of Beth Shemesh or the inhabitants of Beth Anath; but they dwelt among the Canaanites, the inhabitants of the land. Nevertheless the inhabitants of Beth Shemesh and Beth Anath were put under tribute to them.
